

Artist Bio

Heather Griffin is a multi-faceted, Dallas-based artist, designer, and photographer who specializes in nature and portraiture. Griffin's appreciation for wildlife was influenced by her upbringing in rural Arkansas. She was born in Texas but soon moved to El Dorado, Arkansas, sandwiched between Heather's grand-parents on one side and her great-grandmother on the other side. Heather grew up surrounded by family, romping in the woods, leading her sisters Marian and Bridget on various imaginary adventures. Time passed and Heather graduated from Junction City High School as Salutatorian in her class of 2005. She was granted full scholarshp - based on the merit of her portfolio- to pursue a degree in graphic design. Four years later she graduated with honors from at Southern Arkansas University in Magnolia with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 2009. Upon completing college, she moved to Dallas for new career opportunities.

In 2011 she married her college sweetheart Ben Griffin. Since then Heather Griffin has worked in pattern artwork design for home bedding, as well as graphic design, illustration, apparel design, and photography. After giving birth to her daughter Audrey in 2015, Heather began focusing more on her daughter and fine art. In what little free time remains after her parenthood, design jobs, and artistic hobbies, Griffin enjoys fine dining, playing piano, adventures with her husband, her family and dogs.

Artist Statement

I have always loved drawing faces and animals. The face is the most identifying part of a person or animal, where they are truly discerned as unique. My affection for animals is a way I extend my appreciation for nature beyond just the immediate vanity of humankind. To admire and truly know both, I capture their realistic features through keen observation, while still allowing myself impressionistic freedom. I usually work with oil paints, watercolors, acrylics, or pencil, but photography is the first step. Art is a way I pay tribute to nature and the master creator, God, so I look to the elaborate details in nature to guide my art. Thus photography allows me to steal a slice of reality, or a treasured memory, to use as reference to paint later.

Memories are important to me and an integral part of my work. When I was a kid, I would lead my two younger sisters in adventures in the woods of south Arkansas, climbing trees, catching animals, and imagining adventures. These experiences gave me a great admiration and comfort in the outdoors, a fascination of the "wild" in nature, and a special fondness for those few who adventure along the way. When I wasn't outside, I was often following the artistic footsteps of my mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother before me-- both sides of my family--all of whom also painted from nature as well as portraiture.

I like to derive social and family narratives from the characters in my wildlife art and photography, and to convey personality in my painted animals. Recognizing our similarities with animals provides both humor and humility. Often that which separates us from the animals is of utmost importance. What primitive behavior should we improve and what wild spark should we embrace?
